




Median Household Income







Qualified Opportunity Fund (QOF)



- \$2 trillion in capital gains sit on the ledgers of investors and corporations.
- Investing in an Opportunity Zone can significantly the reduce investor and corporate capital gains tax burden.
- A Qualified Opportunity Fund (QOF) is an investment vehicle for investing in eligible property that located in an Opportunity Zone.
- As of October 2019, there are 184 QOFs worth \$44 billion. Up from 145 and \$29 billion in June 2019.
- By January 2020, QOFs are projected to have \$100 billion.






